#### 5. Emergency Management Working Group Report from Peter Wright:

The Emergency Response Management working group has continued to work on plans for the villa residents in the event of a natural emergency such as the bushfires that threatened last year. We have divided the independent villas into 15 zones of around 12 residences each.

We have 15 volunteers to act as street wardens to assist residents with their response in an emergency.

Steve Jacobson has agreed to take on the role of Chief Warden and David Figgins has agreed to be Deputy Chief - thanks Steve and Dave for putting your hands up.

The working group will be meeting with AVEO management on 28 October to discuss our plans for responding to emergencies in the village.

Village Manager Richard is proceeding to make purchases for our shopping list from the \$10,000 grant offered by AVEO to help us manage such events.

This includes two-way radios, loud hailers, hard hats and high vis vests.

A Warden briefing and training session has been set down for 13 November.

After that Wardens will begin contacting residents in their zones to introduce themselves and to encourage any residents who have not done so to complete the survey distributed in June. We had over 60% response to the survey, but we would like to get close to 100% because this i will provide important information in the event that another emergency affects the village.
